BRINGING HEALTHCARE TO COMMUNITIES



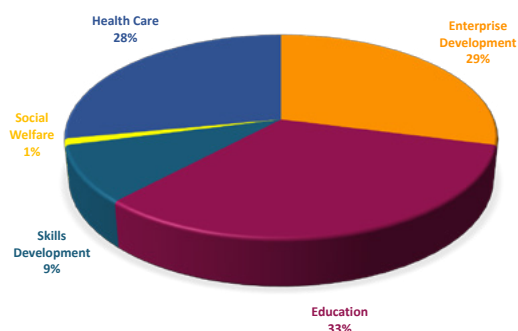
Over 300 community members have been impacted through our Mobile Health Clinic programme, which ran for one week in March 2025. This year, the programme focused on delivering essential healthcare services to school learners, educators, and local community members across the Madibeng District in the North West Province.

The fully equipped mobile unit provided a wide range of health services, including primary healthcare screenings, optometry check-ups, and dental assessments, to four schools and three community clinics.

Additionally, the programme provided health education, delivering vital sessions that addressed issues such as bullying, healthy eating, substance abuse, teenage pregnancy, and water safety.

A total of 35 medical referrals were facilitated, and 87 pairs of glasses were prescribed as a result of the programme. Overall, 367 individuals were reached, surpassing the initial target of 328.
