HEALTHCARE SERVICES AT SCHOOLS

Towards the end of 2021, De Wildt Solar launched a school health programme to promote early identification and treatment of health barriers to learning, while raising awareness about health issues.

The programme was successful in providing healthcare services to both learners and community members. A total of 148 learners from Polonia Primary, Malatse Motsepe High, IB Damons Combined, Mohajane Primary and Motlutlong High School benefitted from the mobile clinic. In addition to this, 169 community members received primary healthcare screenings and referrals via a mobile health clinic.

The learners also received optometry screenings, dental screenings, dental cleaning and scaling, as well as Tuberculosis and Covid-19 screenings.

IB Damons Combined School

This School Health Programme is one of our flagship programs designed to provide long term health services for community members while relieving the local health system.

16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM AGAINST GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

As part of the 16 days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence national campaign, De Wildt Solar held dialogues with learners and men in partnership with the Department of Social Development and local Non-Profit Organisations.

The purpose of these dialogues was to raise awareness on domestic violence and rape, as well as equipping young boys and girls with knowledge about Gender-Based Violence (GBV) and bullying. At the end of the dialogue sessions, learners were able to identify causes of bullying and GBV, along with recommendations for action.

A dialogue with men in the **Mmakau community** was conducted with the aim of changing the narrative on GBV. During the dialogue, we discussed ways of preventing gender-based violence and protecting the vulnerable.





DONATION TO LOAGO LA RONA VICTIM EMPOWERMENT CENTRE

In support of the fight against gender-based violence and child abuse and as part of our Hearts and Minds project, care packs, stationery and PPE were donated to a local Non-Profit Organization, Loago La Rona Domestic Violence Care & Community Development Centre.

The centre provides temporary shelter to abused women and children, care and support victims of abuse and crime, and offers psychosocial services 24 hours a day.

BURSARIES FOR TERTIARY EDUCATION

De Wildt Solar is granting scholarships to successful applicants who passed Matric in 2021, including those who passed Matric in previous years and qualified to study an undergraduate degree or National Diploma at a recognized University or TVET College. This forms part of our Socio-Economic Development initiative, which has a keen focus on education.

To qualify, applicants must live within 50Km's radius of the Solar Plant in the Madibeng Local Municipality. The scholarship will cover tuition fees; accommodation; meals; books; laptop; transport; and living allowance.

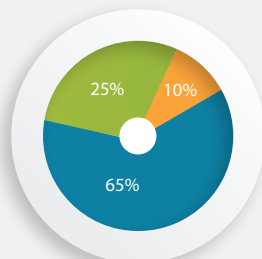


2022 UPCOMING COMMUNITY MEETINGS
